According to IATA dangerous goods regulations 59th edition there is a listed special provision that allows for some refrigerating machines to be shipped without the issuance of a dangerous goods declaration. This exemption also negates the need to mark and label as would a fully regulated shipment would be required. Section 4.4 Special Provisions

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
